Increased state aid to K-I2 education

In this scenario, the state would spend an additional \$154 million, which is close to the amount of revenue the state would gain under a sales tax base expansion we examined earlier in this series, in state aid for K-I2 schools. The Legislature increased state aid to K-I2 schools in the late 1990's and significantly lowered property taxes. This scenario assumes all of the increased aid is used to lower property taxes. This measure would likely provide no benefit to renters who don't directly pay property taxes.
