




Over 20% of Nebraskans are Now a Person of Color




Non-White Nebraskans, 1990




Non-White Nebraskans, 2000










Poverty Rates by Race & Ethnicity, 2018








Nebraskans without Health Insurance Coverage




Populations without Health Insurance Coverage Nebraska & USA




COVID-19 Cases in Nebraska




COVID-19 Deaths in Nebraska






Percent of Total Population Arrested in Nebraska* 3-year (2017-2019) averages




Percent of Incarceration by Race & Ethnicity, 2013
